INTRODUCTION

This document is a Consent Agreement regarding Rosemary Cole's license to practice practical nursing in the State of Maine, entered into pursuant to 32 M.R.S.A. Section 2105-A(1-A)(C) (1988). The parties to this Consent Agreement are: Rosemary Cole, the Maine State Board of Nursing ("Board") and the Department of Attorney General, State of Maine.

By prior Consent Agreement dated June 29, 1990, Ms. Cole surrendered her Maine license to practice practical nursing. Ms. Cole requested reinstatement of her license in a letter to the Board dated March 5, 1991. Subsequently, the Board requested that Ms. Cole attend an informal conference pursuant to 32 M.R.S.A. Section 2105-A(1-A). The informal conference was held on May 1, 1991. Ms. Cole was present and was not represented by an attorney.

FINDINGS OF FACT

As a result of the informal conference, the Board made the following findings of fact:

- 1. Licensee has to date met all of the conditions of her June 29, 1990 Consent Agreement.
- 2. Licensee has continued in her aftercare program.
- 3. Licensee states that her family is supportive of her recovery.
- 4. Licensee's employer, Volmer Nursing Home, Inc., is supportive of her recovery.

COVENANTS

Based on the above findings of fact, the Board voted to enter in an agreement with Ms. Cole whereby her license will be reinstated for a probationary period of one year pending compliance with the following conditions:

- 1. Licensee must continue with her prescribed aftercare and self-help programs.
- 2. Licensee must remain completely substance-free.
- 3. Licensee must arrange for her aftercare counselor to submit quarterly reports to the Board beginning on August 1, 1991, and a final report if the counselor recommends termination of aftercare counseling.
- 4. Licensee must arrange for any nurse employer to submit quarterly reports to the Board.
- 5. Licensee must inform any nurse employer of the probationary status of her license to practice practical nursing in Maine, and provide any nurse employer with a copy of this Consent Agreement.

DV. President A Note

Ms. Cole understands that this document is a Consent Agreement which affects her rights to practice nursing in Maine. Ms. Cole understands that she does not have to execute this Consent Agreement and that she has the right to consult with an attorney before entering into this Consent Agreement. Ms. Cole affirms that she executes this Consent Agreement of her own free will.
