This Consent Agreement is entered into by and among Anne L. Dolloff, R.N., the Maine State Board of Nursing (hereinafter "the Board"), and the Department of the Attorney General, State of Maine. Ms. Dolloff voluntarily surrendered her R.N. license to the Board on January 15, 1987 and entered into a Consent Agreement with the Board at that time. She applied for reinstatement of her license by letter dated November 18, 1987. The Board requested that she attend an informal conference pursuant to 32 M.R.S.A. § 2105-A(1-A). At the informal conference held on December 17, 1987, Ms. Dolloff was present without counsel. Following the conference, the Board made the following finding of fact:

A. FINDING OF FACT

 Ms. Dolloff has met all of the conditions of her previous Consent Agreement.

B. COVENANTS

Pursuant to 32 M.R.S.A. § 2105-A(1-A)(B), the Board voted to reinstate Ms. Dolloff's license under a six-month probationary status beginning December 17, 1987. The conditions of the probation are:

- 1. Ms. Dolloff must remain chemical free.
- Ms. Dolloff must continue with her substance abuse counseling and aftercare, including attendance at Alcoholic Anonymous and/or Narcotics Anonymous meetings.
- 3. Ms. Dolloff must participate in random urine testing at least monthly. She must arrange for reports of that testing to be sent to the Board.
- 4. Ms. Dolloff must arrange for 3-month and 6-month progress reports to be sent to the Board from her substance abuse counselor and her nurse/employer by March 17, 1988 and by June 17, 1988. She waives any claims of confidentiality and privilege with respect to these reports and any urine testing reports.

Ms. Dolloff understands and agrees that, at the end of the six-month probationary period she may apply to have the

probationary conditions lifted by the Board at its discretion.
