**INTRODUCTION**

This document is a Consent Agreement regarding Shirley A. Frasier’s license to practice professional nursing in the State of Maine. The parties enter into this Agreement pursuant to 10 M.R.S.A. § 8003(5)(B) and 32 M.R.S.A. § 2105-A(1-A)(C). The parties to this Consent Agreement are Shirley A. Frasier (“Licensee”), the Maine State Board of Nursing (“Board”) and the Department of Attorney General, State of Maine. The parties reached this Agreement on the basis of a complaint referred to the Board by the State of Maine Department of Human Services, Bureau of Medical Services, Division of Licensing and Certification by letter dated July 23, 1999 and supporting documentation in Complaint Narrative No. 99-C-H-610, a complaint received by the Board dated October 18, 1999 from Marcia L. Jones and information by letter dated November 8, 1999 from MaineGeneral Medical Center (“MaineGeneral”).

**FACTS**

1. The matter came before the Board regarding Shirley A. Frasier's (“Ms. Frasier”) competence to practice nursing and her compliance with standards of professional conduct and behavior established in the practice of nursing.
2. The facts arise from an incident that occurred on or about March 12, 1999 while Ms. Frasier was employed at MaineGeneral.

**AGREEMENT**

3. Shirley A. Frasier enters this agreement for a voluntary permanent revocation of her registered professional nursing license in the State of Maine without admission that she violated Title 32 M.R.S.A. § 2101, et. seq. of the LAW REGULATING THE PRACTICE OF NURSING and without admission to any alleged facts, however, Ms. Frasier understands that this document is a Consent Agreement that affects her rights to practice professional nursing in the State of Maine. Ms. Frasier understands that she does not have to execute this Consent Agreement and that she has the right to consult with an attorney before entering into this Consent Agreement.



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4. Shirley A. Frasier affirms that she executes this Consent Agreement of her own free will.
5. This Consent Agreement is not subject to review or appeal by the Licensee and may be enforced by an action in the Superior Court.
6. This Consent Agreement becomes effective upon the date of the last necessary signature.
