CONSENT AGREEMENT
REGARDING PROBATIONARY
STATUS OF LICENSE

INTRODUCTION

This document is a Consent Agreement regarding Randy L. Johnson's license to practice professional nursing in the State of Maine, entered into pursuant to 32 M.R.S.A. Section 2105-A(1-A)(B) and 10 M.R.S.A. Section 8003(5)(B). The parties to this Consent Agreement are: Randy L. Johnson, R.N., the Maine State Board of Nursing ("Board") and the Department of Attorney General, State of Maine.

On December 3, 1986 the Board received a letter from Mr. Johnson stating his intention to surrender to the Board his licenses to practice professional and practical nursing. The Board voted to accept Mr. Johnson's voluntary surrender of his licenses. On March 3, 1992 Mr. Johnson requested reinstatement of his registered nurse license. On June 10, 1992 Mr. Johnson met with the Board. At that time the Board voted to deny his request for reinstatement, pending receipt of a report of evaluation by a licensed substance abuse counselor. On November 6, 1992 the Board received such a report from Glen H. Footman, M.S., R.S.A.C. Mr. Johnson met again with the Board on February 10, 1993, at which time the Board voted to reinstate his license to practice professional nursing with certain conditions. This Consent Agreement reflects that decision.

COVENANTS

The Board voted to enter in an agreement with Mr. Johnson under which his license is reinstated on probation for a period of two years from February 10, 1993 with the following conditions:

- 1. Mr. Johnson will remain completely substance-free.
- Mr. Johnson will notify any nurse employer of the existence of this Consent Agreement and of its terms.

- 3. Mr. Johnson must arrange for quarterly reports to the Board from his substance abuse counselor and from his nurse employer. Mr. Johnson waives any claims of confidentiality and privilege which he may have with respect to these reports.
- 4. Mr. Johnson will immediately notify the Board of any employment in the field of nursing, and of any change in nurse employment.
- 5. The Board agrees to take no further action upon these facts so long as Mr. Johnson fully complies with these conditions.
- 6. Mr. Johnson understands that this document is a Consent Agreement which affects his rights to practice nursing in Maine. Mr. Johnson understands that he does not have to execute this Consent Agreement and that he has the right to consult with an attorney before entering this Consent Agreement. Mr. Johnson affirms that he executes this Consent Agreement of his own free will.
