 FOR VOLUNTARY
 SURRENDER OF LICENSE**

INTRODUCTION

This document is a Consent Agreement (“Agreement”) regarding Maggie Robinson-Henry’s license as a registered professional nurse in the State of Maine. The parties to this Agreement are Maggie Robinson-Henry (“Licensee” or “Ms. Robinson-Henry”), Maine State Board of Nursing (“Board”) and the Office of the Attorney General, State of Maine. An informal conference was held on January 7, 2011 and continued on October 20, 2011. The parties enter into this Agreement pursuant to 32 M.R.S. § 2105-A (1-A) (C), 10 M.R.S. §§ 8003 (A-1) (4), 8003 (5) (B) and 8003 (5) (D). The parties reached this Agreement on the basis of 1) a Board Complaint dated February 19, 2009 with information from Judith Doran, RN dated February 9, 2009; 2) a Board Complaint dated June 17, 2009 with information from “Concerned Parents” dated May 24, 2009; and 3) a Board Complaint dated June 17, 2009 regarding Ms. Robinson-Henry’s driving history record.

FACTS

1. Maggie Robinson-Henry has been licensed as a registered professional nurse to practice in Maine since July 20, 2005.
2. Maggie Robinson-Henry has a history of substance abuse dating back to 2002. Many of these instances are in connection with motor vehicle offenses, most recently being arrested and charged on September 4, 2011 with Operating Under the Influence and Violating a Condition of Release, the latter by possessing and consuming alcohol which was a bail condition for a May 2011 conviction for Operating After Suspension. Ms. Robinson-Henry has also been recently diagnosed with alcohol-dependence and mental health issues.
3. Maggie Robinson-Henry agrees that she has a substance abuse problem and is currently in treatment with medical treatment providers.
4. Maggie Robinson-Henry is currently not working as a registered professional nurse.
5. Maggie Robinson-Henry has offered to voluntarily surrender her registered professional nursing license based upon the above-stated facts and thereby waives her right to an adjudicatory hearing.

AGREEMENT

6. The Maine State Board of Nursing will accept Maggie Robinson-Henry’s offer to voluntarily surrender her registered professional nursing license. Ms. Robinson-Henry understands and agrees that should this matter go to hearing before the Board on the above-stated facts and the underlying information to support those facts, it is more likely than not they would support the Board’s findings in this Agreement. Further, she understands and agrees that this document imposes discipline regarding her nursing practice in the State of Maine. The grounds for discipline are found under Title 32 M.R.S. § 2105-A (2) (B), 2(C), (2) (F) and (2) (H) and Chapter 4, Sections 1(A) (2), 1(A) (3), 1(A) (6) and 1(A) (8) of the Rules and Regulations of the Maine State Board of Nursing. Specifically, the violations are:




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Title 32 M.R.S. §§:

- a. 2105-A (2) (B). Habitual substance abuse that has resulted or is foreseeably likely to result in the licensee performing services in a manner that endangers the health or safety of patients. (See also Rule Chapter 4, Section 1.A.2.)
 - b. 2105-A (2)(C): A professional diagnosis of a mental or physical condition that has resulted or is foreseeably likely to result in the licensee performing the licensee's duties in a manner that endangers the health or safety of the licensee's patients (See also Rule Chapter 4, Section 1.A.3.)
 - c. 2105-A (2) (F). Unprofessional Conduct. Ms. Robinson-Henry has engaged in unprofessional conduct by violating standards of professional behavior that have been established in the practice for which she is licensed. (See also Rule Chapter 4, Section 1.A.6.)
 - d. 2105-A (2) (H). A violation of this chapter or a rule adopted by the Board. (See also Rule Chapter 4, Section 1.A.8.)
7. Maggie Robinson-Henry understands and agrees that her nursing license will remain on surrender status and subject to the terms of this Agreement indefinitely until and unless the Board, at her written request, votes to reinstate her license. Ms. Robinson-Henry understands and agrees that if the Board reinstates her license, it will be for a probationary period.
 8. The State of Maine is a "Party state" that has adopted the Nurse Licensure Compact ("Compact"), which is set out in Chapter 11 of the Rules and Regulations of the Maine State Board of Nursing. The State of Maine is Ms. Robinson-Henry's "Home state" of licensure and primary state of residence, which means that Ms. Robinson-Henry has declared the State of Maine as her fixed permanent and principle home for legal purposes; her domicile. Other Party states that are in the Compact are referred to as "Remote states," which means Party states other than the Home state that have adopted the Compact. Ms. Robinson-Henry understands that this Agreement is subject to the Compact.
 9. Maggie Robinson-Henry understands that she does not have to execute this Consent Agreement and has the right to consult with an attorney before entering into the Agreement.
 10. Maggie Robinson-Henry shall not work or volunteer in any capacity for a health care provider in Maine as defined by Title 24 M.R.S. § 2502 (2) or in any position holding herself out as a registered professional nurse or with the designation "RN" while her nursing license is surrendered.
 11. This Agreement is a public record within the meaning of 1 M.R.S. § 402 and will be available for inspection and copying by the public pursuant to 1 M.R.S. § 408.
 12. Modification of this Agreement must be in writing and signed by all parties.
 13. This Agreement is not subject to review or appeal by the Licensee, but may be enforced by an action in the Superior Court.
 14. Maggie Robinson-Henry affirms that she executes this Agreement of her own free will.
 15. This Agreement becomes effective upon the date of the last necessary signature below.

I, MAGGIE ROBINSON-HENRY, RN, HAVE READ AND UNDERSTAND THE FOREGOING CONSENT AGREEMENT. I UNDERSTAND THAT BY SIGNING IT, I WAIVE CERTAIN RIGHTS. I SIGN IT VOLUNTARILY, KNOWINGLY, AND INTELLIGENTLY AND AGREE TO BE BOUND BY THIS AGREEMENT. I UNDERSTAND THAT THIS CONSENT AGREEMENT CONTAINS THE ENTIRE AGREEMENT AND THERE IS NO OTHER AGREEMENT OF ANY KIND.


