Field Team Partnership Opportunities:

6-Person Team

"Full Teams" – composed of 1 Team Leader, 1 Assistant Team Leader and 4 Team Members. These teams welcome local volunteers, but are able to complete projects with minimal support. \$4,500/wk

3-Person Team

"Mini Teams" - composed of 1 Team Leader and 2 Team Members. A good choice for smaller projects. A Mini Team will assure that your project makes progress - with or without volunteers on a daily basis. \$2,850/wk
