## Fees for Plant and Plant Product Export Certification

Below are some of the potential fees associated with exporting plant products from Maine. This list is not exhaustive and some shipments may be subject to additional fees. Upon submission and review of the "Application for Certification to Export Plants or Plant Products From Maine to Other States" the Horticulture Program will contact you regarding the type of certification needed and the estimated or actual costs to certify the shipment.

Type of Certification	Fee
State Phytosanitary Certificate	\$60/certificate for shipments valued under \$1250 \$106/certificate for shipments valued over \$1250
Compliance Agreements	\$60 for businesses and individuals with a nursery license \$106 for businesses and individuals that are not required to obtain a nursery license
Growing season, field inspection or other certification that requires additional inspections	\$50/inspector/hour plus \$0.50/mile traveled
Federal phytosanitary certification	\$66/certificate for shipments valued under \$1250 \$112/certificate for shipments valued over \$1250
