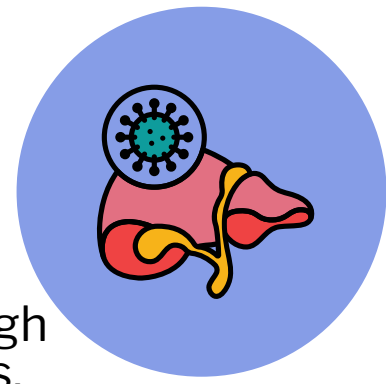


Hepatitis C: Get Tested, Get Treated!



What is Hepatitis C?

Hepatitis C is a contagious liver disease spread through blood to blood contact caused by the hepatitis C virus.

What are some symptoms?



Fever



Nausea or vomiting



Stomach pain



Dark urine or diarrhea



Loss of appetite



Yellow eyes or skin



Feeling very tired

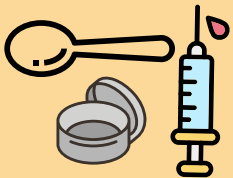
How can I treat hepatitis C?

Hepatitis C can be cured.

- Treatment can be as easy as one pill a day.
- Treatment is covered by MaineCare and most private insurers.
- There are payment assistance programs if you are uninsured.
- People who use drugs do not need to stop using to be treated.

Talk to a health care provider about starting treatment.

How can I prevent hepatitis C?

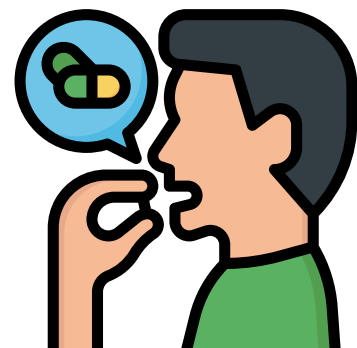


Avoid sharing needles and other drug materials. Use new needles, cookers, cottons or reuse your own materials every time you use.



Find a syringe service program near you.

Get tested. Get treated.
