Maine CDC's TB Control Program

Tuberculosis (TB) is an infectious disease that can be treated and cured. The TB Control program can help pay for testing, diagnosing, and treatment.

Steps for state funded aid:

My patient has TB Disease or Latent TB Infection.



Send a referral form to TB Control program.



Bill patient insurance.

 If patient has MaineCare, then MaineCare covers all costs.



TB Control pays at the contracted Medicaid rate.

My patient is identified by Maine CDC as a close contact of a person with active TB disease.



Bill patient insurance.

• If patient has MaineCare, then MaineCare covers all costs.



TB Control pays at the contracted Medicaid rate.

Exceptions:

- TB Control does not pay for anything that is not connected to TB.
 - TB can spread to different areas of the body. Many tests may be necessary. If a charge is not recognizable, TB Control will request provider notes. The TB epidemiologist will read the provider notes to determine if the charge is TB related.
- TB Control cannot reimburse anyone for bills already paid.
- TB Control does not cover TB testing for patients whose test results are negative **unless** they are identified as a close contact with an active case.

Billing Notes:

- Providers must be in the State of Maine billing system.
 - Complete the Maine W-9 Vendor form with matching Federal Tax IDs, Title, and payment mailing address. If any information has changed, a new form must be filled out before TB Control can issue payment.
- Bills sent to the TB Control Program need to be on a Health Insurance Claim Form.
