The best way to prevent HPV cancers is to give the vaccine on time, between the ages of 9 and 12. Getting the HPV vaccine on time can prevent over **90% of HPV cancers later in life**. The vaccine is safe, effective, and long-lasting. We know how important it is for you to keep your child safe, healthy, and happy, which is why we strongly recommend getting your child the HPV vaccine on time.

HPV vaccination is for all children.

Age matters. Acting early can give your child the best chance to be protected from HPV cancers. **All children** (both boys and girls) should get two doses of the vaccine between ages 9 and 12. Children over age 13 will also benefit from this vaccination.
