What is 317?

Section 317 of the Public Health Service Act authorizes the federal purchase of vaccines to vaccinate children, adolescents, and adults.

Over its 50-year history, 317-purchased vaccine has been directed towards meeting the needs of priority populations; most recently this has been under and uninsured adults.

317 vaccine plays a critical role in achieving national immunization coverage targets and reductions in disease for adults.

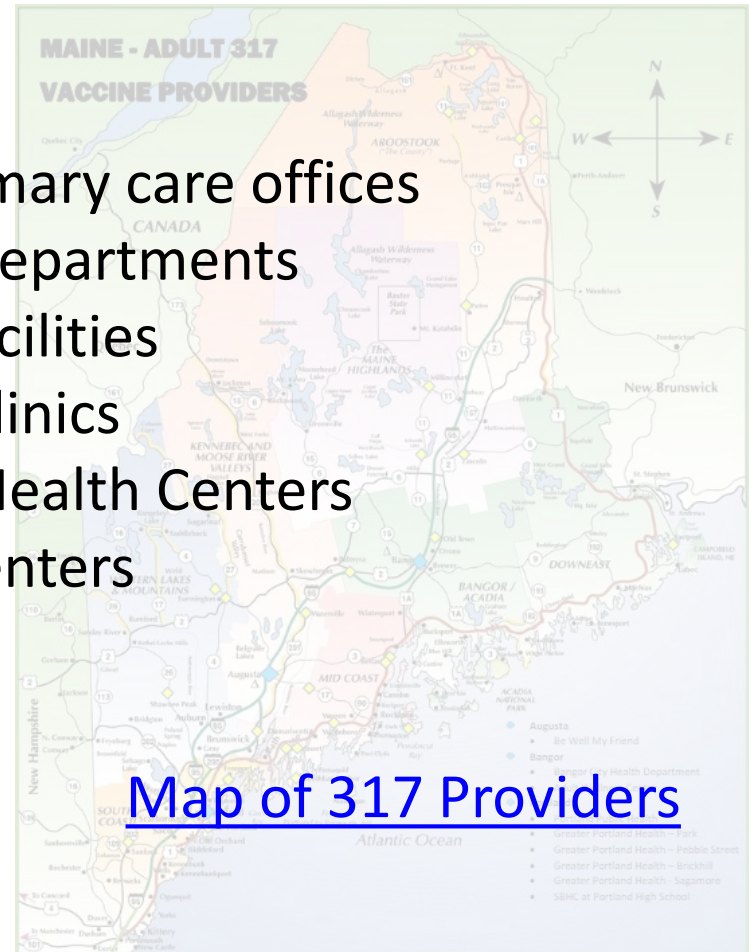

Enrollment

- Complete Enrollment documentation
- Enrollment site visit conducted
- Vaccine Coordinators complete annual education
- Provider Agreement and Vaccine need completed in ImmPact
 - Optional ImmPact functionality training provided

*If already a VFC provider with MIP your site only needs to complete one form to enroll into the 317 Adult Program.



Eligibility



- **19 years of age or older**

AND:

- ✓ **Uninsured**
- ✓ **Underinsured**

(i.e., has health insurance that does not pay for immunizations)



This does not include:

- Patients with deductibles that must be satisfied before coverage kicks in, or
- Patients that must receive vaccines at a pharmacy

MaineCare patients do not qualify.

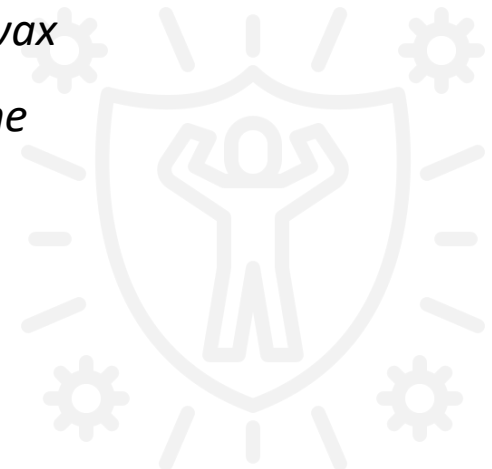
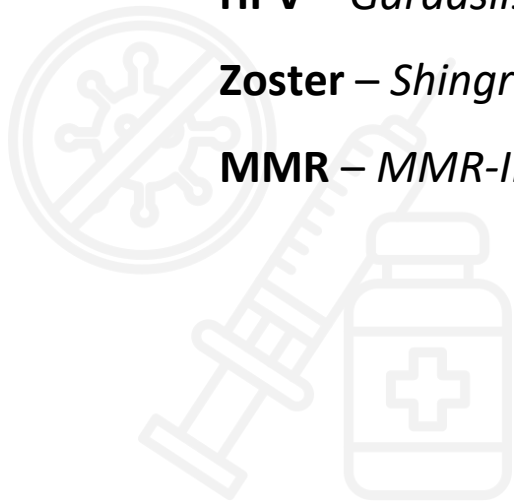

Requirements to Receive Ordered Vaccines

Requested orders will be approved case-by-case, depending on previous vaccine usage, compliance, and available funds.

Orders will be placed on the **second Wednesday of each month.**

On the date of ordering, your site must:

1. Reconcile your site's inventory
2. Update your site's cold chain

*****Must be completed on the same day orders are placed, between 12:01am and 11:00am***
