


Cary Medical Center **

In 2023 Cary Medical Center is partnering with ACAP on the MESUPS grant to continue to provide substance use prevention programming. We promoted safe storage of medications, national drug take back days, and continued educational campaigns on substance use prevention. Cary's Power of Prevention program updated and distributed the comprehensive directory of substance abuse and addition services. MAT and suboxone therapy is now offered at Pines. Narcotics prescription contracts in the Cary ED and Pines. We have been promoting 9-8-8 and other suicide prevention programs and resources through social media and education campaigns. Education provided at health fairs and health promotion events.

ACAP, Center for the Advancement of Rural Living, Caribou Police Sheriff, Roads to Recovery Community Center, and Recovery Aroostook

We continue to support the two recovery houses in Caribou. Staff members continue to teach Prime for Life in the Aroostook County Jail and in local schools. The jail program has been very successful and receives accolades from the Sheriff's office and partner organizations. Dr. Samuela Manages and Dept., Aroostook County Jodi Cote, PMHNP-BC are providing evaluation, treatment, and management for substance use recovery. They aim to provide comprehensive treatment and care for in-patient and out-patient substance use care. Through the MESUPS grant we also distributed lock boxes and information on safe storage. We also partnered with local businesses on the sticker shock alcohol awareness program to help prevent underage drinking.

In 2024 we continue our partnership with ACAP on the MESUPS grant which includes safe storage promotion, Prime for Life classes and additional prevention outreach programs. Dr. Manages and Jodi Cote continue building the MAT and suboxone therapy program through Pines. Suicide prevention campaign for older adults and lethal means prevention education is in development for the next guarter. Education provided at health fairs and health promotion events.

ACAP, Center for the Advancement of Rural Living, Caribou Police Dept., Aroostook County Sheriff, Roads to **Recovery Community** Center, and Recovery Aroostook.

The Prime for Life class is still being offered in the County jail. The partnership with ACAP and Cary on the MESUPS grant was renewed and is going strong. A new evidence-based program on media and its impact on substance use will be introduced in the schools this fall. Gun locks and suicide prevention materials will be available at the Cary security desk for free.

In 2023 Cary and Pines provided financial assistance to patients in need and ensured price transparency. Cary and Pines work together and with partner medical organizations to provide seamless care and ease of access to care for patients. The Seniority program offers access to annual labs and educational lunch and learns. Helped promote the library's telehealth program for access to telehealth appointments with tech support. Hosted the health fair with free screenings, flu shots, and information from partner organizations. The Age Friendly Caribou program is hosted by Cary and provides resources, programs, and connection through the community. Cary partnered with the Caribou Rec on Caribou Cares About Kids to provide games, entertainment, and gave out 1,000 Frisbees and chalk at the parade. The Caring Together magazine is still a great resource for health information and news from Cary and Pines. Seniority has hosted several lunch and learns on Eat Mediterranean, dementia support, and more. Cary and Northern Light AR Gould partnered on two spring healthy aging luncheons and will be partnering on two more this fall.

Cary Medical Center

In 2023 Cary Medical Center and Pines Health Services provided smoking cessation kits, and promoted low-dose CT screening as well as other screenings like mammography and colonoscopies. Screen Aroostook was also an avenue to education on radon and lung cancer risk. We also continued to grow the Pink Aroostook program and hosted several fundraisers and events for breast cancer support in the County. We hosted a cancer support group. PSAs and advertising through local media and social media aired highlighting new screening equipment like our CT and MRI, as well as the importance of regular screenings and check-ups for early detection. Dr. Elena Vagia, oncologist joined the Jefferson Cary Cancer Center. We have also increased promotion of the Maine CDC Breast and Cervical Health Program.

In 2024 Cary and Pines continued to provide smoking cessation kits and promote the importance of cancer screenings and early detection. We applied for additional grants for radon education and kits, and continue to promote low-dose CT. Pink Aroostook is partnering closely with the Jefferson Cary Cancer Center on new resources for patients. Pink Aroostook has also grown with the number of patients seeking support.

We created tobacco cessation kits that have resources and nicotine replacement therapy, and provided them to Pines patients and staff that indicated they wanted to guit. Several hundred kits have been distributed. Our low-dose CT scan numbers have dramatically Cancer Society, National Breast increased helping people who have smoked or are smokers detect Cancer Coalition, Jefferson Cary cancers earlier. We supported more than 20 breast cancer patients Cancer Center, and the Maine through Pink Aroostook and provided almost \$10k in support for their travel, bills, medication, prosthetics, etc. Tim Horton's selected Pink Aroostook as the charity of choice for their smile cookie campaign in Aroostook. Pink Aroostook also hosted the Tea of Hope for survivors.

Cancer Foundation, American Cary and Pines were both recognized with at the Platinum level for the Cancer Society, National Breast Gold Standards of excellence program in Maine for Breathe Easy. Tim Cancer Coalition, Jefferson Cary Horton's once again selected Pink Aroostook to receive the Aroostook Cancer Center, and the Maine County smile cookie donation funds.
