




SCHNA Overview

ME CDC Highlights

- Conducted a Local Public Health Systems Assessment in 2022 using the <u>10 Essential Public Health Services (EPHS) Framework</u>
 - Results were used in a funding process to provide \$80,000 to a local agency to help improve outcomes for vulnerable populations via infrastructure support.
 - Sacopee Valley Health Center (SVHC) was awarded funding to improve radio communications, food security hub, and cold chain vaccine storage
- Maine CDC created a new Healthcare Coalition(HCC) structure with new district chapters.
 - A Statewide and District Hazard Vulnerability Analysis was conducted in May 2024.

In collaboration with the Androscoggin Community Health Stakeholders Coalition, explored and researched how to become a trauma-informed community in Lewiston/Auburn, and applied for – and received – a \$5,000 grant from the Simmons Foundation to offer two series of Trauma-Informed Trainings led by the Maine Resiliency Building Network.

Each series included 3 separate trainings, "The Impact of Experiences", "Creating and Sustaining a Trauma-Informed Organization", and "Spreading HOPE: Healthy Outcomes from Positive Experiences"

Access to Care – Targeted Case Management

WMCA has recently hired a case manager and have the pieces in place to begin in July of 2024. TCM will be available to our clients experiencing homelessness, a currently underserved population.

Children & Family – Our Place to Grow Childcare

WMCA has been working with the hospital on a childcare center. Due to winter flooding the project was delayed substantially, but it's now set to open late summer or early fall and offer additional childcare slots needed in the area.

Housing & Energy - Home Repair, Central Heat Improvement, Weatherization and Homeless Services

WMCA has a robust Housing department that assists low-income client with needed repairs to their homes or heating systems, as well as Weatherization to help them save on energy costs. These modifications often allow clients to remain in their homes as they age. WMCA's Homeless services include helping clients obtain housing vouchers and assisting with the search for affordable housing. They also try to work with families before they become homeless with very limited funds for rent payments.
