One in 13 Americans have asthma. This toolkit is an educational resource for the Maine CDC Asthma Self-Management Education Program (ASME). It's a program to help Mainers who are being treated for asthma but feel asthma is still causing problems in their life.

What is ASME?

The ASME Program empowers patients with the knowledge and tools needed to control their asthma and **live healthier lives**. Through education and support, participants learn to understand their condition, properly use their medications, create personalized asthma action plans, and identify and reduce triggers in the comfort of their home. The Program is fully funded through a grant from the US CDC's National Asthma Control Program.
