# HAZARD VULNERABILITY ANALYSIS

The York District Healthcare Coalition recently held a Hazard Vulnerability Analysis with its various healthcare and emergency management partners. A Hazard Vulnerability Analysis (HVA) is a systematic tool that helps identify and prioritize potential hazards and risks that could impact a facility or community.

HVAs can help organizations and facilities allocate resources to the most likely or severe incidents based on a calculated risk scale. HVAs can also help organizations develop documentation for accrediting organizations, comply with conditions of participation, and score emergency preparedness.


