Prevention: Substance Use and Tobacco Prevention	Maine CDC provides funding to partners across the state to engage in prevention programming, under the umbrella of the Maine Prevention Network. In Cumberland Public Health District, Maine CDC has contracted with Cumberland County Public Health to carry out this work, along with several sub-contracting partners. The theme of this meeting was to hear back from Cumberland County Public Health about the work they have completed so far under the funding, in two areas of prevention: Substance Use and Tobacco Prevention (the other two funded prevention areas are Health Eating, Active Living, and Youth Engagement and Empowerment). In addition to the work of the Maine Prevention Network, other partners were invited to talk about the important work they are doing around tobacco and substance use in local communities of Cumberland County: Westbrook Partners for Prevention, Be the Influence (Windham and Raymond), and MaineHealth's Center for Tobacco Independence (CTI).	
Janet Lewin Westbrook Partners for Prevention	Highlights of Westbrook Partners for Prevention's work included: - Developed a Youth Advisory Council (YAC) to directly involve youth in prevention efforts, significantly growing from 4 to 40 active members due to personal connections and engaging topics.

Val Johnstone & Angela Giordano Cumberland County Government and Public Health	 Created a vaping PSA displayed at Apple Cinemas, garnering over 53,000 impressions. Introduced Sharps boxes, overdose recognition, and response trainings, compliance checks with police, and collaborated with Opportunity Alliance and City of Portland Public Health. Implemented "One Box" Naloxone distribution in strategic community locations. Conducted staff training, updated policies to distribute Naloxone, developed equity initiatives, and provided resources for parents. Collected shared data from the SupportME Coalition that was run by Healthy Communities of the Capital Area and analyzed and presented by Maine CDC. Engaged in the planning process in the Lakes Region surrounding vaping prevention, funded by MeHAF. In the process of hiring a Multicultural Prevention Specialist position to enhance community engagement and support.
