## **Frannie Peabody Center**

- Peabody Center provides low barrier free HIV testing and linked to care. Peabody Center has several partners that are helping distribute HIV self-test kits. Been a cluster of HIV outbreak in the Bangor area mostly with individual who are unhoused and injecting drugs.
- Peabody Center would be happy to coordinate that a partnership in other agencies to help distribute self-test HIV kits. Also working with the FDA approved over the counter test kits to distribute to people that may be at risk.

# Maine Access Immigrant Network (MAIN)

- Mainly Teeth in office, since May. This service is open to anybody with a community focus on refugee immigrants.
