
SURVIVORS SINCE 2001¹

Lung cancer is the <u>number 1</u> leading cause of cancer death.

The 5-year relative survival is **28.5%**.²

Maine ranks <u>23rd</u> in the US for lung cancer 5-year survival rate.






INCIDENCE RATE PER 100,000

Risk Factors

- Smoking
- Secondhand smoke
- Indoor radon exposure
- Environmental exposures

Cigarette smoking is linked to 80-90% of lung cancer deaths. High-risk populations should talk to their doctors about Low-Dose CT scans. ⁴

Nearly 6 in 10



people diagnosed at a localized stage will survive at least 5 years (vs 1 in 10 at a distant stage).⁵


MAINE CDC CANCER REGISTRY (MCR)

The MCCCP is funded by Maine's Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

The program provides leadership and coordination of Maine's statewide comprehensive cancer control efforts and is guided by the goals and objectives outlined by the Maine Cancer Plan.


