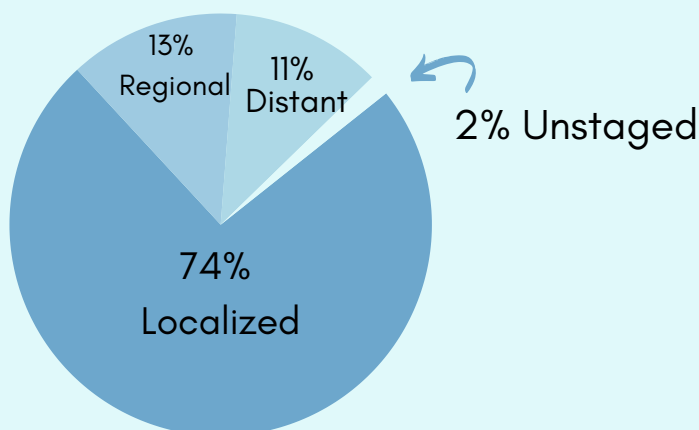
SURVIVORS SINCE 2001¹

Prostate cancer is the **5th** leading cause of cancer death.

The 5-year relative survival is **96.4%**.²

Maine ranks **36th** in the US for ³ prostate cancer 5-year survival rate.

STAGE AT DIAGNOSIS



Nearly All



males diagnosed at a **localized** stage will survive at least 5 years (vs 4 in 10 at a distant stage).⁵

Male 112.9

Most common cancer among Maine males

MORTALITY RATE PER 100,000

Male 21.0

Rate per 100,000 age-adjusted to the 2000 US standard population

Risk Factors

- Age
- Family history or genetics
- Race
- Dairy and calcium
- Vitamin E and folic acid supplements

If you are a man between the ages of 55 and 69, talk with your doctor about when or if to begin screening for prostate cancer.⁴

+ Prevalence counts are an estimate of the number of survivors on 1/1/2023 who were diagnosed between 2001-2022.

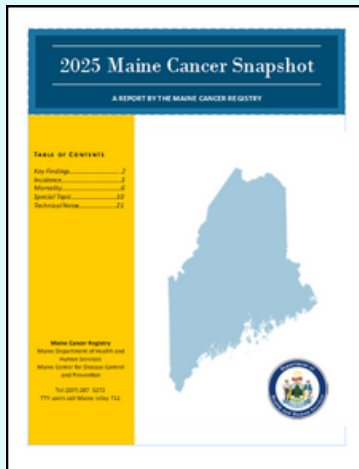
MAINE CDC CANCER REGISTRY (MCR)

MAINE CDC COMPREHENSIVE CANCER CONTROL PROGRAM

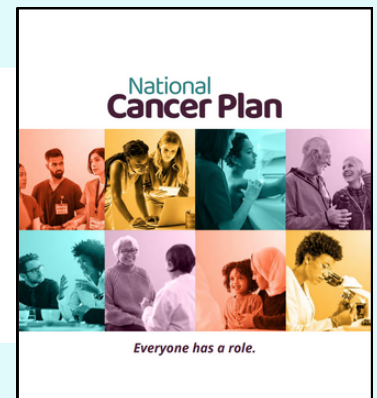
