

Prostate cancer is the <u>5th</u> leading cause of cancer death.

The 5-year relative survival is **96.4%**.²

Maine ranks **36th** in the US for 3 prostate cancer 5-year survival rate.

males diagnosed at a **localized** stage will survive at least 5 years (vs 4 in 10 at a distant stage).


MAINE CDC CANCER REGISTRY (MCR)

The program provides leadership and coordination of Maine's statewide comprehensive cancer control efforts and is guided by the goals and objectives outlined by the Maine Cancer Plan.




