WIC Nutrition Program (WIC)

WIC serves pregnant women, breastfeeding women, and children up to age 5, including foster children. WIC is complete nutrition care and offers healthy foods, nutrition education, breastfeeding support and referrals to other services.

Children with Special Health Care Needs (CSHN)

Children with Special Health Care Needs works with families of children with special health care needs under the age of 22. CSHN can guide families and organizations in finding resources to best fit the needs of their child. Staff can navigate families through complex medical systems, connecting them to the care that will achieve the very best possible patient outcome.







Child Development Services/ **Early Intervention**

The Child Development Services/Early Intervention system is an Intermediate Educational Unit that provides both Early Intervention (birth through two years) and Free Appropriate Public Education (for ages three through five years) under the supervision of the Maine Department of Education.



CradleME helps connect you with the right homebased services for you and your baby for free. CradleME is a partnership between two programs: **Public Health Nursing and Maine Families.**



Care (POSC)

Maine's Plan of Safe Care is created between a healthcare or social services provider, mother and/or other caregivers, identifying family strengths and needs, beneficial resources and actions to best support substance exposed infants and families. A Plan of Safe Care often includes referrals to services or providing contact information to families for their own follow-up.



Health Coverage for Maine

Health Coverage for Maine (CoverME.gov) provides information about free and low-cost health insurance options for Maine families. You can also find a directory of local organizations that can help you understand your coverage options and complete an application.

Maine Families

Maine Families is a statewide network of community teams serving the needs of pregnant women and parents with newborns. Public Health Nursing (PHN)

Maine CDC Public Health Nurses provide in-home health services for families. All prenatal and postpartum women and all newborns and infants up to 12 months of age may receive a visit from a Public Health Nurse. If you have questions about your health or your baby's health, you may request a nurse at any time by calling the CradleME number.
