## Shellfish Harvesting Area Classification – Notification of Changes

September 3, 2024

**This notice is in effect until repealed or replaced.**

Ladies and Gentlemen:

Under the authority of 12 M.R.S.A. § 6172; the Commissioner has made the following changes to Growing Area EL, Petit Manan Point to Ripley Neck (Ripley). This notice reclassifies a portion of Flat Bay (Harrington) from Conditionally Approved to Approved due to water quality meeting approved standards year-round. All existing pollution and biotoxin closures remain in effect.

The boundary descriptions of the area are as follows (struck text is being removed and underlined text is being added):

Prohibited: Effective immediately, because of pollution, it shall be unlawful to dig, take or possess any clams, quahogs, oysters, mussels or whole or roe-on scallops taken from the shores, flats and waters of the following Prohibited areas:

- P1. Upper Harrington River (Harrington): north of a line beginning at the southern tip of Plummer Point (Harrington) running southeast to the point where the southern portion of Sunset Point Road (Harrington) meets the shore.
- P2. Narraguagus River to Mitchell Point (Cherryfield and Milbridge): northwest of a line beginning at the northeast tip of Long Point (Milbridge) then running northeast to the southwest tip of Fickett Point.
- P3. Smith Cove to Stover Cove (Milbridge): north of a line beginning at a red painted post on the northwest shore of Stover Cove running east to the northern point of the eastern shore at the mouth of Stover Cove, then running east to the USCG navigational aid, "C5"; AND south of a line beginning at the USCG navigational aid "C5" running northwest to the retaining wall at the north shore of Smith Cove.

Restricted: Effective immediately, because of pollution, it shall be unlawful to dig, take or possess any clams, quahogs, oysters, mussels or whole or roe-on scallops (from aquaculture leases with an MOU only) from the shores, flats and waters of the following Restricted area without a special MDMR permit:

- R1. Curtis Creek (Flat Bay, Harrington): north of a line beginning at a red painted post located at the western point of land at the mouth of Curtis Creek, running to a red painted post on the opposite shore.
- R2. Turner Cove (Milbridge): southwest of a line beginning at the northern tip of Turner Point (Milbridge) running northwest to the shoreside bulkhead of Jordan's Pier.
- R3. Stover Cove (Milbridge): south of a line beginning at a red painted post on the northwest shore of Stover Cove running east to the northern point of the eastern shore at the mouth of Stover Cove.

Conditionally Approved (Seasonal): Effective immediately, because of seasonal pollution, it shall be unlawful to dig, take or possess any clams, quahogs, oysters, mussels or whole or roe-on scallops (from aquaculture leases with an MOU only) from the shores, flats and waters of the following Conditionally Approved area(s) during the closed dates:


- ~~CA1. Flat Bay (Harrington) south of a line beginning at a red painted post at the western point of land at the mouth of Curtis Creek, running east to a red painted post on the opposite shore; AND north of a line beginning at a red painted post on the tip of a prominent point of land on Keylog Shore and running west to the opposite shore (closed June 1<sup>st</sup> through October 31<sup>st</sup>).~~
- CA1. Back Bay (Milbridge): north and east of a line beginning at a red painted post located on the east shore of Wallace Cove running northwest to the north tip of Little Island, then running northwest in line with the eastern side of Back Bay Ledge to a point of land located on the west shore of Back Bay in line with the Milbridge FCC Cell Phone Tower (closed June 1<sup>st</sup> through October 31<sup>st</sup>).

Approved: All other shores, flats and waters not described in the above sections are Approved and it is lawful to dig, take or possess any clams, quahogs, oysters, mussels or whole or roe-on scallops (from aquaculture leases with an MOU only) when in the open status.
