This proposed rule-making incorporates the minimum lobster size required by Addendum XXVII: Increasing Protection of the Gulf of Maine/Georges Bank Spawning Stock that was originally approved by the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission (ASMFC) in May 2023. In October 2024 Addendum XXXI postponed the implementation of certain measures from Addendum XXVII to July 1, 2025. For compliance with the current Interstate Fisheries Management Plan, this regulation implements changing the minimum size of lobster from 3 ¼ inches to 3 5/16 inches, effective July 1, 2025.

Chapter 25: LOBSTER AND CRAB REGULATIONS

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25.76 Lobster Minimum Size

Except as provided in 12 MRS § 6431(1-A,) a person may not buy, sell, give away, transport, ship or possess any lobster that is:

- A. Prior to July 1, 2025, less than 3 1/4 inches in length, as determined by the lobster measure certified in accordance with 12 MRS § 6431(3).
- **B.** July 1, 2025 and after, any lobster that is less than 3 5/16 inches in length, as determined by the lobster measure certified in accordance with 12 MRS § 6431(3).

Grace period: See 12 MRS § 6431(6-A)

ANALYSIS AND EXPECTED OPERATION OF THE RULE: [see §8057-A(1)(B)&(D)] It will be unlawful for a person to buy, sell, give away, transport, ship or possess any lobster that is less than 3 5/16 inches effective July 1, 2025. A 180 day grace period is provided in law for a person holding a wholesale or retail seafood dealer license or a lobster transportation license to handle lobsters legally purchased or received in the prior year which do not meet the new minimum size requirement.

ECONOMIC IMPACT, WHETHER OR NOT QUANTIFIABLE IN MONETARY TERMS: [see §8057-A(2)(A)]

Absent a change in the gauge, there is significant interannual variability in lobster landings and in lobster revenues. It is anticipated that a proportion of the catch will not be available to harvest until the following molt, which will impact the number of lobsters harvested in the second half of the year and the following spring. The overall value of the fishery is variable and depends heavily on market conditions. Increased price can compensate for decreases in landings, reducing economic impact.

INDIVIDUALS, MAJOR INTEREST GROUPS AND TYPES OF BUSINESSES AFFECTED AND HOW THEY WILL BE AFFECTED: [see §8057-A(2)(B)] Lobster harvesters will be affected by a decrease in the number of lobsters they will be allowed to legally retain. Lobster dealers may be affected by a decrease in the supply of lobsters. Lobster dealers that import lobsters from Canada may be affected by a decrease in the number of lobsters that they may import from Canada because lobsters less than 3 5/16 inches will be prohibited from being imported after July 1, 2025. Lobster processors will also be affected by not being able to process lobsters less than 3 5/16 inches. However, the purpose of the management measure is to increase the resiliency of the lobster stock to ecosystem change, which is intended to benefit the industry that relies upon this resource.

BENEFITS OF THE RULE: [see §8057-A(2)(C)]

Addendum XXVII, with which this rule complies, was implemented as a proactive measure to improve the resiliency of the Gulf of Maine/Georges Bank lobster stocks to ecosystem change, based on concerns about persistent low lobster settlement over the last decade. Addendum XXVII established a trigger mechanism to implement management measures – specifically gauge and escape vent sizes – to provide additional protection of the Gulf of Maine/Georges Bank spawning stock biomass. In October 2023, management measures including a series of gradual changes to gauge and escape vent sizes in LCMAs 1, 3 and OCC were triggered based on an observed decline in recruit abundance indices. The Board set the implementation date for these measures to January 1, 2025. Addendum XXX was approved in August 2024 to clarify the Commission's recommendation that the increased minimum gauge size in LCMA 1 triggered under Addendum XXVII would also apply to foreign imports of American lobster. In October 2024, the Board approved Addendum XXXI, postponing the implementation of certain measures from Addendum XXVII to July 1, 2025 to allow Canada more time to consider implementing complementary management measures, as well as reduce potential economic impacts to the US and Canadian lobster industries.
