

Climate Education Taskforce Strategies and Recommendations for the Maine Climate Literacy Plan

Executive Summary:

The Maine Climate Literacy Plan is an Addendum to the Maine Environmental Literacy plan that lays out recommendations to advance climate literacy in the State of Maine. This plan includes strategies, recommendations and action steps to synchronize, expand, and monitor efforts over time.

In 2024, The Maine Department of Education convened a taskforce of educators, youth, environmental organizations, school leadership, and other key parties from throughout the state to design an Addendum to the Maine Environmental Literacy Plan. The taskforce was convened in partnership with the Maine Environmental Education Association and was funded in part by the Maine Governor's Office of Policy Innovation and the Future.

This Plan provides actionable and timely recommendations and action steps for the Department and other responsible parties to advance climate education and Green School support for students, educators, schools, and school administrative units (SAUs) throughout the state of Maine.

	The Maine Department of Education will collaborate with Higher Education to support that preservice
	teacher training in Maine includes climate education within the next four years.
	Starting in 2025, the Maine Department of Education will work with the support of the Scientific and Technical Subcommittee of the Maine Climate Council, to produce a "Maine Climate Change for Schools Annual Report" which will synthesize Maine climate data for a school-, educator-, and student-accessible document.
Develop a holistic Maine Green Schools Program	The Maine Department of Education will conduct a survey of school sustainability policies in Maine and develop templates and funding for Maine Schools to create specific policies and plans to support climate education and green infrastructure starting in Winter 2025.
	The Maine Department of Education in collaboration with community-based organizations will create and facilitate a statewide Green Schools Network within the next four years.
	The Department of Education will re-launch and maintain the US Department of Education Green Ribbons Award Program in Fall 2024. In addition, the Maine Department of Education will launch a tiered state specific recognition. This recognition program will collect and communicate success stories across the state.
